

visit places of educational and historical interest, as well as for radio, television and personal appearance concerts. On Sundays, each boy attends the church or Sunday school of his faith, transportation being furnished.

C. The school has a television set which the boys may watch during free time, evenings and after study hall.

D. The boys have a number of Hobby Clubs which meet, as a rule, once a week. These include a Camera Club, Stamp Club, Dramatics Club, Chess Club and Library Club.

MUSIC

A. Boychoir rehearsals are scheduled at 11 - 12 a.m., 1:45 - 2:45 and 3:30 - 4:15 p.m. daily except weekends. Guests are welcome at these rehearsals.

B. All boys are instructed in Music Theory, in classes according to their ability. The Beginners' Theory Class studies the basic principles of music theory, and the Advanced Class is devoted mostly to original composition work, while the Intermediate Class learns more advanced principles of theory and elementary composition.

C. Piano lessons are elective and are not included in regular school tuition, although the lessons may be taken at the school and practice periods are arranged. The charge is \$2.50 per half hour for lessons, and unless a student is advanced, he usually takes one lesson a week. A piano recital is held during Commencement Week.

D. Whenever possible, arrangements are made for interested boys to attend musical performances in Princeton, Philadelphia and New York.

GENERAL

A. School opens on the first Monday after Labor Day and closes at the end of May.

B. Boys have vacations at Thanksgiving, Christmas and in the spring. The dates of these vacations are announced as soon as we know what our concert and other commitments will be.

C. Reports are sent to the parents six times during the year.

D. Any boy living near the school may go home weekends (beginning Friday after school and returning Sunday in time for supper), if he has completed his assignments, and provided there are no special concerts or rehearsals. In most cases, it is considered best for a new boy to spend his first weekend at school. Boys "sign out" before leaving and "sign in" upon returning.
