APPOINTMENT of Mr. Lauren D. Rhine, assistant headmaster of the Meadowbrook School, a country day school for boys near Abington, Pa., as successor to Dr. T. Robert Bassett, headmaster of the Boychoir School, has been announced by Mr. William M. Lanning, president of the board of trustees. The appointment was confirmed by the board at a meeting held last Sunday afternoon. Dr. Bassett has resigned to accept a post as headmaster of the Friends Boys School, Ramallah, Jordan, effective August 1st. Mr. Rhine will begin his new duties September 1st. Born in Altoona, Pa., in 1926, Mr. Rhine is a graduate of Eastern Baptist College, St. Davids, Pa., and holds a bachelor of divinity degree from the Reformed Episcopal Theological Seminary and master of theology from the Westminster Theological Seminary, both in Philadelphia. He has also studied in the schools of education of the University of Pennsylvania and Temple University. He taught in elementary schools at Manahawkin, N. J., and Solebury, Pa., before taking his present position. He married Miss Geraldine Louise Waubough in 1948 and the Rhines have three children, all boys, David, 10, Stephen, 8, and Jonathan, 6. Mr. Rhine is director and part owner of The Hill Camp, Chesham, N.H. The Rhine family will take up residence at the Boychoir School in August.
