PRINCETON CAMPUS ANNOUNCED AS NEW HOME OF THE BOYCHOIR CAMP



It was announced after the Winter Meeting of the Board of Trustees that camp would be moved to the beautiful 22 acre campus of The Columbus Boychoir School in Princeton, New Jersey.

"The Camp for Musical Boys" celebrates its 20th season with this new and exciting move. In 1942 Herbert Huffman, the founder and director of The Columbus Boychoir for nineteen years, opened the first season of camp at Chautauqua, N.Y. After spending 15 years at Chautauqua the camp was moved to Shawnee-on-the-Delaware in 1958, to be associated with the Fred Waring Music Workshop. The trustees and administration of the camp believe the principle objectives of the camp will be better served in this new move.

Mr. Donald Bryant, Musical Director, has announced the plans for additional musical activities made possible by this new move. Along with the usual choral training campers receive in rehearsal with the regular members of the Columbus Boychoir, additional instruction will be given

in theory, private vocal and piano lessons.

The campers will be quartered in large army squad tents on screened platforms. They are grouped according to age, with counselors supervising each group. A maximum of sixty boys can be accommodated ranging in age 8 to 14.

"Albemarle," home of the Boychoir Camp and School, is located two miles west of Princeton. The camp has the use of two large playfields, large areas of wooded land, a creek, tennis court, and swimming pool. These surroundings afford the campers a fine opportunity to satisfy their enthusiasm for outdoor play, exploring and adven-
